Management's Discussion & Analysis
Three Months Ended January 31, 2021 and 2020

The following Management's Discussion & Analysis ("MD&A") as provided by the management of Top Strike Resources Corp. ("Top Strike" or the "Company") should be read in conjunction with the Company's unaudited condensed interim financial statements and accompanying notes for the three months ended January 31, 2021 and 2020 and audited financial statements and accompanying notes for the years ended April 30, 2020 and 2019. All financial measures are expressed in Canadian dollars unless otherwise indicated. Top Strike's MD&A and financial statements were prepared under International Financial Reporting Standards ("IFRS"). The reader should be aware that historical results are not necessarily indicative of future performance. The effective date of this MD&A is March 29, 2021.

Management is responsible for the preparation and integrity of the financial statements, including the maintenance of appropriate information systems, procedures and internal controls and to ensure that information used internally or disclosed externally, including the financial statements and MD&A, is complete and reliable. The Company's board of directors follows recommended corporate governance guidelines for public companies to ensure transparency and accountability to shareholders. The board's audit committee meets with management on a quarterly basis to review the financial statements including the MD&A and to discuss other financial, operating and internal control matters.

Statements in this report that are not historical facts are forward-looking statements involving known and unknown risks and uncertainties, which could cause actual results to vary considerably from these statements. DESCRIPTION OF BUSINESS AND OVERVIEW

The Company trades under the symbol "VENI" on the Canadian Securities Exchange and "TPPRF" on the OTCQB Venture Market ("OTCQB"), a US trading platform operated by the OTC Markets Group in New York.

The Company's principal place of business is located in Calgary, Alberta. The address of the Company's head office is Suite 310, 250 6th Avenue SW, Calgary, Alberta, T2P 3H7.

Prior to September 24, 2018, Top Strike Resources Corp. (dba Vencanna Ventures, "**Vencanna**" or the "**Company**") had no activity and had not earned significant revenues and was listed on the TSX Venture Exchange. The Company had previously focused on international and domestic oil and gas projects, but has expanded its scope to consider other industries as well.

On September 24, 2018, the Company announced the completion of a recapitalization financing, the appointment of a new management team and board of directors and commencement of trading on the Canadian Securities Exchange. The transactions have transitioned the Company from an oil and gas issuer to a merchant capital firm, rebranded as "Vencanna Ventures", providing capital to early-stage global cannabis initiatives including state compliant opportunities in the United States.

The full impact of the Covid-19 pandemic and jurisdictional policies put into effect to counter the virus (including social distancing and the closure of certain non-essential services) are unknown at this time. While most US states have deemed access to medical cannabis an "essential" service, and many state jurisdictions have been working with their local cannabis associations in designing safe strategies to maintain the delivery of cannabis to their respective patients and customers, it is unknown if this will be continued or how future policies will impact US cannabis businesses.

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DESCRIPTION OF BUSINESS AND OVERVIEW (CONTINUED)

The global cannabis industry continues to expand with demand increasing due to patient and customer growth, as well as new jurisdictions expanding their access to cannabis for both medical and recreational purposes. During the Covid-10 pandemic, in most jurisdictions cannabis was considered an essential service. However, cannabis continues to be illegal at the U.S. federal level. The Secure and Fair Enforcement (SAFE) of Banking Act (which was passed on September 25, 2019 by Congress), The Strengthening the Tenth Amendment Through Entrusting States (STATES) Act, and the Marijuana Opportunity Reinvestment and Expungement (MORE) Act, are three pieces of legislation seeking to reform federal cannabis laws in the United States. While these pieces of legislation have yet to be enacted, the Democrats, who are generally more supportive of cannabis reforms than Republicans, currently have a majority in Congress, have control of the Senate, and hold the Whitehouse. During his campaign, President Biden indicated his support for cannabis decriminalization.

All of the November 2020 marijuana ballot initiatives were successful; Arizona, Montana, and New Jersey supported adult use legalization, Mississippi approved medical use, and South Dakota was the first state to approve medical and adult use simultaneously. Continued momentum for cannabis legalization can be expected as more and more congresspeople sign on and co-sponsor cannabis legalization bills, the continued focus of the racial implications associated with cannabis laws, and the potential positive economic impact from the legal cannabis business.

The Company derives 100% of its income from the cannabis industry in certain states in the United States which is illegal under the federal laws of the United States. However, the Company is not aware of any non-compliance by the Company or its investees that would be contrary, or illegal, under applicable state laws. While Management believes that the Company is on track to accomplish its stated business objectives, continued reform and global legalization of cannabis will create both greater opportunities, and potentially a more competitive environment for cannabis-based companies and its service providers thereby potentially affecting market conditions and hence affecting our foregoing milestones.

HIGHLIGHTS AND RECENT DEVELOPMENTS

On March 12, 2021 Vencanna announced that it had entered into a loan agreement with the Cannavative Group LLC (“Cannavative”) for US\$2.0 million (the “**Loan**”). Further, the Company announced that it had entered into an exclusive non-binding letter of intent with Cannavative (the “**LOI**”), pursuant to which Vencanna will acquire all of the common shares in the capital of Cannavative in an all-share exchange through the issuance of an aggregate of 360,000,000 common shares of Vencanna (“**Vencanna Shares**”) at a deemed issuance price of US\$0.05 per Vencanna Share (~\$0.065 per Vencanna Share, the “**Transaction**”).

The Transaction is subject to, among other things, the execution of a definitive agreement between Vencanna and Cannavative (the “**Definitive Agreement**”) and customary closing conditions. The Transaction is subject to the acceptance of the CSE and the approval of shareholders of Vencanna. Shareholders holding not less than 50% plus one Vencanna Share of the issued and outstanding Vencanna Shares will approve the Transaction by way of written resolution. The Transaction is expected to be completed in the summer of 2021.

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HIGHLIGHTS AND RECENT DEVELOPMENTS (CONTINUED)

The Loan matures on March 11, 2022, at which time Cannavative will repay the Loan in its entirety including any accrued interest. Prior to the execution of the Definitive Agreement, interest on the Loan shall be 17.5% per annum. Upon execution of the Definitive Agreement, interest shall be reduced to 12.5% per annum.

About Cannavative

Cannavative is a leading premium cannabis brand in the state of Nevada, producing a wide variety of flower and extracted products, including its award-winning infused pre-roll, the Motivator. Cannavative has deep penetration into the Nevada market as its products are sold in over 80% of the state's dispensaries and retail outlets. Cannavative is a multi-cup winner; a gold and silver medalist at the 2020 Las Vegas Cannabis Awards, in 2019 they won the Jack Herer Cup for their vape pen, and in 2018, Leafly named them the Best Flower Products brand. Based in Reno, Nevada, they have 14,500 square feet of canopy, with the ability to significantly expand to meet their growing demand. In addition, the facility houses a 10,000-sf state-of-the-art pharmaceutical-grade extraction lab and kitchen.

The Nevada market continues to grow. According to Nevada Department of Taxation, Q4 2020 cannabis sales were 26% higher in 2020 than 2019. This in spite of the fact that tourism was down 55%. BDS Analytics projects the NV market will grow another 27% in 2021 to \$1 billion in sales.

As of the date hereof, a major portion of the Company's business was derived from material ancillary involvement in US cannabis-related activities. As at January 31, 2021, 66% of the Company's assets and 100% of income was directly related to US cannabis activities.

RESULTS OF OPERATIONS

Financial results for the three months ended January 31, 2021 and 2020

Overall, the Company recorded a net loss of \$663,014, \$(0.00) per share for the three months ended January 31, 2021 as compared to a net gain of \$59,196, \$0.00 per share for the three months ended January 31, 2020.

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RESULTS OF OPERATIONS (CONTINUED)

Revenue for the three months ended January 31, 2021 was \$142,842 (2020 – \$307,630) and was derived solely from interest income.

Expenses for the three months ended January 31, 2021 was \$805,856 (2020 - \$248,434) of which \$554,260 (2020 - \$Nil) is related to unrealized changes in fair market value for investments and other financial instruments and \$251,596 (2020 – \$248,434) is related to general and administrative expenses.

The unrealized loss of \$554,260 consists of \$351,000 (2020 - \$Nil) from the change in fair market value of the derivative portion of the convertible debenture which increased due to higher volatility of the common shares of the Company during the quarter. The remaining unrealized loss of \$203,260 (2020 - \$nil) was due to the impact of foreign currency fluctuations related to the Company's investments and its convertible debenture.

General administrative expenditures of \$251,596 (2020 -\$248,434) included, salaries and benefits of \$145,077 (2020 - \$147,370), share-based compensation \$4,719 (2020 - \$18,786), interest and bank charges of \$62,485 (2020 – \$551), corporate communications expense of \$14,139 (2020 - \$31,662), professional fees of \$6,727 (2020 – \$19,268), office expenses of \$9,759 (2020 – \$1,773) and other expenses of \$8,690 (2020 - \$29,024).

LIQUIDITY, FINANCINGS AND CAPITAL RESOURCES

At January 31, 2021, the Company had a cash balance of \$3,320,285 (April 30, 2020 - \$3,745,922) to settle current liabilities of \$50,019 (April 30, 2020 - \$76,132). As at January 31, 2021, the Company's cash decreased by \$173,500 from October 31, 2020, primarily related to operating activities during the year.

The Company has no commitments for property and equipment expenditures for fiscal 2021. The Company anticipates that any property and equipment expenditures based on future needs, will be funded from cash on hand and the issuance of equity securities.

CRITICAL ACCOUNTING ESTIMATES AND JUDGMENTS

The timely preparation of the financial statements requires management to make judgments, estimates and assumptions that affect the application of accounting policies and reported amounts of assets and liabilities and income and expenses. Accordingly, actual results may differ from these estimates. Estimates and underlying assumptions are reviewed on an ongoing basis. Revisions to accounting estimates are recognized in the period in which the estimates are revised and in any future periods affected.

Critical judgments in applying accounting policies

The following are the critical judgments, apart from those involving estimations (see below), that management has made in the process of applying the Company's accounting policies and that have the most significant effect on the amounts recognized in these financial statements.

Fair value of financial instruments

For Level 3 investments and complex instruments where quoted prices are not readily available the Company values its investments using recognized valuation models. Some or all of the significant inputs

into these models may not be observable in the market, and are derived from market prices or rates or are estimated based on assumptions. Valuation models that employ significant unobservable inputs require a higher degree of management judgment and estimation in the determination of fair value. In determining fair value for these types of instruments: the history and nature of the business; operating results and financial conditions; the general economic, industry and market conditions; capital market and transaction market conditions; contractual rights relating to the investment; comparable trading and transaction multiples, where applicable; and other pertinent considerations are taken into consideration. Adjustments to the carrying value of the investments may also be determined when there is pervasive and objective evidence of a decline in the value of the investment, as indicated by an assessment of the financial condition of the investment based on operational results, forecasts and other developments since acquisition.

Although the Company believes that its estimates of fair value for Level 3 investments are appropriate, the use of different methodologies or assumptions could lead to different measurements of fair value.

Share-based payments

The Company measures the cost of its share-based payments to directors, officers, employees and consultants by reference to the fair value of the equity instruments at the date at which they are granted. The assumptions used in determining fair value include share price, expected lives of the options, risk-free rates of return, share price volatility and the estimated forfeiture rate. Changes to assumptions may have a material impact on the amounts presented.

ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The accounting policies used are consistent with those of the previous financial year as described in Note 3 of the Company's financial statements for the year ended April 30, 2020. With the exception of the following policy.

Government grants

The Company receives grants periodically from different governmental incentive programs. Grants are recognized initially when there is reasonable assurance the grant or subsidy will be received and when the Company believes it is in compliance with the related conditions of the grant or subsidy. The financial aid received for expenditures incurred is recognized against the expenditure in the same accounting period in which the expenditures were incurred.

OFF- BALANCE SHEET ARRANGEMENTS

The Company has not entered into any off-balance sheet arrangements.

PROPOSED TRANSACTIONS

As at the date of this MD&A, other than the Transaction, there are no proposed transactions that the board of directors or senior management have decided to proceed with and that have not been publicly disclosed.

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RELATED PARTY TRANSACTIONS

During the period ended January 31, 2021, \$3,127 (2020 - \$15,493) in legal fees were incurred from a law firm at which the Corporate Secretary of the Company is a Partner. As at January 31, 2021, accounts payable and accrued liabilities included amounts payable to related parties totalling \$20,002 (2019 - \$6,871) for the above professional fees.

The Company loaned its directors, executives and employees cash restricted to the sole purpose of purchasing Company shares on the open market. The related party loans are payable upon demand by the Company, are secured by the underlying stock purchased and bear zero interest. The due from related parties balance was \$146,783 for the period ended January 31, 2021.

On July 3, 2020, the Company announced the purchase of the US\$1,300,000 GOH Note 2 and the issue of a debenture. Jon Sharun, a director of the Company, is a partner of the seller and purchaser of the US\$1,300,000 note and debenture respectively. The debenture carries an interest rate of 8% and is accrued and payable on January 31, April 30, July 31, and October 31 of each year; interest is paid in cash, common stock, or accrued. The Company elected to accrue interest of \$26,912 to the convertible debenture during the period ended January 31, 2021.

SHARE CAPITAL

The Company has an unlimited number of common shares authorized for issuance. At January 31, 2021 there were 181,991,390 common shares issued, 181,491,390 outstanding and 500,000 held in treasury. There are also 117,701,059 warrants and 17,466,740 stock options outstanding.

On October 5, 2020 the Company re-commenced its NCIB (the “**Bid**”). Under the Bid, the Company may purchase up to 5% of the Company’s common shares (“Shares”). The Bid will terminate on the earlier of one year from commencement of the Bid or on the date on which the maximum number of Shares that can be acquired pursuant to the Bid have been purchased. The Corporation reserves the right to revoke the Bid earlier if it determines that it is appropriate to do so. The actual number of Shares that may be purchased under the Bid and the timing of any such purchases will be determined by the Corporation.

The Company is executing the Bid because it believes that, from time to time, the market price of its Shares does not reflect the underlying value of the Company and its prospects, and that depending on the trading price of its Shares and other relevant factors, purchasing its own Shares represents an attractive investment opportunity and is in the best interests of the Company and its shareholders.

All Shares will be purchased under the Bid on the open market and through the facilities of the CSE and payment for the Shares will be made in accordance with CSE policies. The timing and extent of repurchases will depend upon several factors, including market and business conditions, valuation of Shares, regulatory requirements and other corporate considerations. The price paid for Shares will be the prevailing market price at the time of purchase and all Shares acquired by the Company will be cancelled. The Company had 181,991,390 Shares issued and outstanding as of the re-commencement date the BID. Purchases may be suspended at any time, and no purchases will be made other than by means of open market transactions during the term of the Bid. The Corporation has engaged Independent Trading Group (ITG) Inc. to act as the broker through which the Bid will be conducted.

On November 27, 2020 the Company purchased 500,000 Shares at an average price of \$0.015 representing 5.5% of the authorized purchases.

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RISKS AND UNCERTAINTIES

The Company's financial success will be dependent upon the Company's ability to raise equity. There is no assurance that the Company will be able to raise the equity required to meet the obligations of the Company and the Company has no source of financing other than those identified in the previous section. Additionally, given the illegality of cannabis under U.S. federal law (discussed below), the Company's ability to raise equity in the U.S. may be limited. However, these barriers to participation in U.S. capital markets also serve as the Company's competitive advantage when supplying alternative sources of capital to state compliant U.S. cannabis businesses.

Marijuana is illegal under U.S. federal law and the enforcement of such laws poses significant risk to the Company. As at the date hereof, 38 states of the United States plus the District of Columbia, Puerto Rico and Guam have laws and/or regulations that recognize, in one form or another, legitimate medical uses for cannabis and consumer use of cannabis in connection with medical treatment and eleven states of the United States have legalized recreational cannabis. Many other states are considering similar legislation. However, the position of the federal government and its agencies is that cannabis has no medical benefit and, accordingly, a range of activities including cultivation and the personal use of cannabis are prohibited. Unless and until Congress amends the U.S. Controlled Substances Act of 1970 with respect to medical and recreational cannabis, there is a risk that federal authorities may enforce current federal law and the Company may be deemed to be producing, cultivating or dispensing cannabis in violation of federal law or facilitating the selling or distribution of drug paraphernalia in violation of federal law. Active enforcement of the current federal regulatory position on cannabis may thus indirectly and adversely affect the Company's future cash flows, earnings, results of operations and financial condition. As of the date hereof, the Company has not obtained legal advice, either in the form of a legal opinion or otherwise, regarding compliance with applicable state regulatory frameworks and potential exposure and implications arising from U.S. federal law. See the AIF for more information, including a discussion of U.S. federal cannabis laws, guidance given by federal authorities or prosecutors regarding the risk of enforcement action and risks associated with providing financing to U.S. state compliant cannabis businesses.

Impacts of the COVID-19 coronavirus outbreak

The Company cautions that current global uncertainty with respect to the spread of the COVID-19 virus and its effect on the broader global economy may have a significant negative effect on the Company. While the precise impact of the COVID-19 virus on the Company and its US cannabis related investments remain unknown, rapid spread of the COVID-19 virus may have a material adverse effect on global economic activity, and can result in volatility and disruption to global supply chains, operations, mobility of people, consumer spending and the financial markets, which could in turn affect interest rates, credit ratings, credit risk, inflation, business, financial conditions, results of operations for the Company's current and future investments and other factors relevant to the Company.
